Annual American Society of Law, Medicine & Ethics Award

The Center for Law, Health & Society is currently seeking nominations for the annual American Society of Law, Medicine & Ethics (ASLME) award, which is presented on Honors Day at the College of Law. This award is granted to the law student who demonstrates outstanding leadership and community-building in the area of health law.

Criteria:

The ASLME Award is based on demonstrated leadership in health-related and health law activities and community-building efforts at the College of Law. The award recipient must agree to: (1) participate in the next annual ASLME Student Health Law Conference for law students interested in health law careers (usually held in the fall semester) and (2) to act as an ambassador to the law community by bringing back information and advice gathered at the conference and to present it at a public forum open to the law school student community.

Award:

The award includes free registration to attend the ASLME Student Health Law Conference, commemorative engraved plaque, one-year ASLME membership and benefits, and a monetary award to offset cost of travel expenses to the ASLME conference (up to \$500).

How to Apply:

Nominations should be submitted to Professor Charity Scott at cscott@gsu.edu. Self-nominations and nominations by others are accepted. Nominations should address how the nominee meets or exceeds the criteria required for this award.
