PAPER REQUIREMENTS AND DEADLINES

LENGTH Minimum of 25 pages, exclusive of footnotes.

FORMAT Blue book

DEADLINES

Obtain signature of Prof. Budnitz on required form if paper is for writing requirement	ASAP
Select topic and obtain approval from Prof. Budnitz	Sept. 10
Outline due*	Oct. 1
First draft due	Nov. 12
Final paper due	Dec. 18

*The outline should indicate how you intend to deal with your topic (e.g., analyze statute and legislative history, analyze case law, etc.) and what your theme will be (e.g., need for more/less regulation, how split in case law should be resolved, etc.). It should describe the general organization of the paper and contain the names of major cases, if any. It is understood that the outline is tentative and the first draft and final paper may depart substantially from the outline. Discuss substantial changes between the outline and the first draft with Professor Budnitz, however, before submitting your first draft so he is forewarned and can advise you.

CAVEAT If you cannot meet any of the deadlines, you must obtain Professor Budnitz' written permission for any deviation from the above.
