Articles from the Festschrift Symposium Honoring Julian Conrad Juergensmeyer are Published

In 2010, Julian Conrad Juergensmeyer, Professor of Law, Ben F. Johnson Jr. Chair in Law, and Director of the Center for the Comparative Study of Metropolitan Growth, was honored with a Festschrift Symposium celebrating his forty-fifth year of teaching law. The Festschrift Symposium was titled, *A 2020 View of Urban Infrastructure*, and was sponsored by the Center for the Comparative Study of Metropolitan Growth in the College of Law.

Recently, the articles associated with the Festschrift Symposium were published in a dedicated edition of *The Urban Lawyer*, the national journal on state and local government law produced by the American Bar Association. This special double issue of *The Urban Lawyer* features an introduction written by Julian Juergensmeyer, *A 2020 View of Urban Infrastructure: An Introduction and Thank You*, and an article that he co-authored with Professor James C. Nicholas, *Loving Growth Management in the Time of Recession*.

The journal also features an article written by Jim Bross, Professor of Law and Associate Director of the Center for the Comparative Study of Metropolitan Growth, titled *Sewers: Infra Dug and Infra Dig* and an article by the former Dean, Janice Griffith, *Green Infrastructure: The Imperative of Open Space Preservation*. Additionally, there are many other interesting articles by leading scholars from all over the United States, Europe, and the Middle East on a variety of topics including infrastructure planning, transportation, electricity, wastewater, social infrastructure, infrastructure and property rights, and the future of growth management.

Copies of *The Urban Lawyer* were distributed to all attendees of the Festschrift Symposium and members of the American Bar Association Section of State and Local Government Law.
