**Julian Conrad Juergensmeyer Co-Authors the First Handbook on the Transfer of Development Rights Programs**

The *TDR Handbook, Designing and Implementing Transfer of Development Rights Programs*, is the first comprehensive book ever written on transfer of development rights programs. It was written by the leading experts on TDR programs including Arthur C. Nelson, Rick Pruetz, Doug Woodruff, James C. Nicholas, Julian Conrad Juergensmeyer, and Jonathan Witten, and features a foreword written by Dwight Merriam.

TDR programs are an innovative planning tool, enabling the preservation of open spaces, historical sites or buildings, and farmland by shifting the development rights on those parcels to other parcels more suited for higher density. TDR programs are now occurring in 200 communities. The TDR Handbook will serve as an excellent tool for communities looking to create TDR programs. Complete with detail including statutory guidance, model ordinances and suggestions for program administration, the *TDR Handbook* has been praised by law professors, county managers and planners for its thoroughness.

Julian Juergensmeyer is a Professor of Law, Ben F. Johnson Jr. Chair in Law, and Director of the Center for the Comparative Study of Metropolitan Growth at Georgia State University's College of Law. He is also an adjunct professor of planning at Georgia Institute of Technology. Professor Juergensmeyer is the author of nearly 100 books and articles on Property Law, Land Use Planning and Control Law, Environmental Law, Growth Management Law, and Agricultural Law.
