The ability to recruit and protect research participants across multiple sites and multiple states is critical to the success of large-scale precision medicine and other biomedical research to improve human health. Accomplishing this task requires a clear understanding of which state’s laws apply and under what circumstances, but the empirical and normative foundations for addressing choice of law questions in a research context are lacking. This project explores stakeholders’ experiences and opinions regarding choice of law questions in the research context, as well as whether and how existing choice of law frameworks might be applied in resolving them.
