Question #1.

Up until March 23, 2020, I worked full-time for Sea Island Acquisition, cleaning hotel rooms. On March 23rd, my employer laid me off due to the COVID-19 pandemic. I was told not to come into work for 60 days, that is, until May 23, 2020. Nonetheless, since that time, Sea Island Acquisition has offered me work on a part-time basis, around 15 hours per week. (My income for June reflects these reduced hours.) I do not know when, or if, I will go back to working full-time.

Question #1.

The "other" field refers to income provided by my live-in partner, the father of my youngest child, K. E. S. A. We are not married. He plans to move out of state next month, leaving me alone to provide for my family. Currently, he contributes \$400 per month for food. He also pays the electricity bill and the rent for our mobile-home lot.
